# **ILLINOIS POLICE ASSOCIATION CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS**

# Article 3

# Membership

# The current by-law reads:

SECTION 3. ASSOCIATE MEMBERS. There shall be two classes of Associate members. Class A Associate Members and Class B Associate Members.

SECTION 3. PARAGRAPH A - CLASS A ASSOCIATE MEMBER, Class A ASSOCIATE

Member is a law enforcement officer who does not qualify for Active membership because of honorary, special, and auxiliary or reserve law enforcement officer status and law enforcement communication officers and dispatchers.

(Amended September 2000, 2001, 2003)

SECTION 3. PARAGRAPH B - CLASS B ASSOCIATE MEMBER. Class B Associate

Member is a person of high repute in the business community who has been recommended by an Active member.

# The proposed by-law would read:

Associate members will be persons or businesses with a strong desire to support law enforcement within the United States of America and the State of Illinois.

The dues for Associate Members will be determined by the Executive Board of the Association.

Associate Members will not be allowed to hold office or vote on any matter at any meeting of the membership.

### ILLINOIS POLICE ASSOCIATION CONSTITUTION AND BY-LAWS

Article 3, Section 6

# Membership

The current text reads:

**SECTION 6. APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP.** 

An Active member who shall submit the name and the candidates written request for membership on forms provided by the Association must propose a candidate for Active membership. The Executive Director may approve the application if satisfied that the applicant has truthfully and fully answered all questions contained in the application and is entitled to Active membership. In cases where the Executive Director is doubtful of the candidate's eligibility, the application shall be referred to the Board for its decision thereon, which shall be final.

Application for Active membership may not be accepted unless the law enforcement qualifications of the applicant's employer are clearly defined by state or federal status. The Board may deny an application for membership where its acceptance may result in risks or loses being unnecessarily increased or which it is believed would prove detrimental to the operations of the association.

Candidates for Associate or Honorary Memberships shall require the sponsorship of an Active member and such membership shall be issued only in limited number as prescribed by resolution of the Board. Except as explicitly provided for in Article VII, Section 1 or otherwise in these By-Laws, Associate and Honorary members shall not be entitled to the benefits of Active members and shall be precluded from holding office and/or voting at any meeting of the membership.

# **Proposed Language:**

### Section 6 APPLICATION FOR MEMBERSHIP

Any law enforcement officer as defined in Article 3, Section 2 may apply for Active Membership. The application will be made on forms designed and approved by the Executive Board and may be electronic or paper. An application may be subject to verification for accuracy at any time. If any false information is discovered, the application may be denied, or the membership revoked or reassigned as appropriate.

# Membership

The current text reads:

SECTION 8. DECALS. Active members and honorary members shall be issued an automobile windshield decal in the shape of the State of Illinois and Associate "A" and "B" members shall be issued an automobile windshield decal of a unique design, bearing the same serial number as that assigned to the membership certificate, unless the Board determines otherwise.

# ARTICLE 5. OFFICERS AND ELECTIONS

The current bylaw states

SECTION 1. ELECTIVE OFFICERS. The elective officers of the Association shall be:

- A. President
- **B.** First Vice President
- C. Second Vice President
- D. Third Vice President

(Not more than one (1) Vice President shall be elected from any one division)

- E. Executive Director
- F. Two (2) Sergeants-at-Arms and an Auditing Committee consisting of three (3) members.

(Not more than one (1) Auditor from any one division.) All of who shall hold their respective offices for a term of two (2) years or until their successors are elected and qualified. The officers shall be elected by ballot at an annual Conference of this Association by the votes of a majority of the duly accredited delegates present and voting. Provided that no person having been

elected to the office of President shall be eligible to reelection to that office, nor may two (2) members from the same law enforcement department be elected to any office in the Association at the same time.

# Article 5

# **Current bylaw states**

SECTION 1. PARAGRAPH D. ELIGIBILITY FOR ELECTED OFFICER. Only Active members shall be eligible for election to office in the Association. (1) The position of President, 1st Vice President, 2nd Vice President and 3rd Vice President will only be filled with an Active member where he or she has a minimum of Five (5) years as an Active member and a minimum of Four (4) years on a Division Board. The Director shall be an appointed position under the provisions of By-Law Article 4, Section 1, Paragraph D. The position of the Executive Director should be filled by an Active member where he or she has a minimum of Five (5) years as an Active member and Four (4) years on a Division Board. In the event a suitable and acceptable candidate is not available from within the Association, the Executive Board may seek an acceptable private sector candidate for the office of Executive Director who shall work under the guidelines of the Illinois Police Association By-Laws and receive a similar salary and benefits package applicable to the office at the time of appointment.

# By Michael Jackson Chairman Scholarship Committee

In 1994 the IPA Board decided to implement the annual scholarship award program. There were two dominant reasons for this decision:

- 1. To offer a recruitment incentive to prospective new members of the Illinois Police Association.
- To reward our current members for their continued commitment and support for the organization.

On January 16, 2004, the Scholarship Committee held a meeting and reviewed the guidelines of the program. These guidelines were approved by the IPA Executive Board on April 6, 2004 to administer the program in a more efficient and effective manner for the benefit of our membership.

This information is being published to educate applicants and as a guideline for division officers during their review and processing of all required documentation.

All division chairmen will receive a copy of these guidelines and are expected to follow them to that their applicants receive proper consideration for the award. Any and all questions regarding eligibility should be directed to the corresponding division chairman. The scholarship committee of the Illinois Police Association will ultimately review all submitted applications for compliance and has the final decision regarding the awarding of scholarship funds.

The scholarship committee has worked hard to ensure the success of this ongoing program and asks that the following rules are strictly followed. Thank you for your consideration.

### **Eligibility:**

- 1. A child (natural or legally adopted), regardless of residency, of an Active or Active Paid Up life member or a stepchild who resides in the same household of the IPA member. The applicant must be under the age of 24 as of November 1 of the corresponding scholarship year.
- The member must be in good standing with the IPA for least one year prior to the date of application.
- 3. The scholarship applicant must be a full time student carrying a minimum of 12 credit hours per semester or an equivalent number of hours per quarter In an undergraduate capacity.
- 4. Full time nursing students who meet the above criteria are eligible to apply.

# Persons who are not eligible:

- 1. IPA members or spouses.
- Students in a trade, industrial or graduate school.
- 3. Part time students carrying less than 12 credit hours per semester or an equivalent number of hours per quarter.

Eligibility will be predicated upon each division's roster of Active or Active Paid Up life members as of May 1 of the current year. No transfer of members to a different division will be made within 12 months prior to the deadline for application submissions (November 1 of each year) for the purpose of benefiting in the scholarship award program. Applicants may apply to only one division.

# Scholarship Expenditures:

- The current award will be \$500.00 per school year per student. Each eligible student in a family may apply.
- 2. Award winners may reapply annually.
- 3. The Illinois Police Association, Inc. will remit one lump sum payment of \$500.00 to award winner. The payment will be made after the division chairman submits the winning application with all necessary supplementary documentation to the IPA office. All winning applications will then be reviewed and ultimately approved by the scholarship committee.
- 4. Each of the13 divisions of the IPA will receive one scholarship annually (if so submitted) at a cost to the association of \$6,500.00

### **Procedure for Selection:**

All applications will be collected and screened by each division for eligibility and the submission of all necessary documentation. After proper verification the division board will prepare the names of all candidates for a random drawing. The winner will be drawn by the chairman at a regular meeting of the division no later than the 30th day of November in the corresponding year. The chairman will also draw the name of the one alternate winner who will not be announced.

Should the announced winner be ineligible for any reason then the alternate be awarded the scholarship and announced at a later date. Divisions should retain all submitted applications in event that the alternate is also found ineligible and yet another winner may have to be selected.

The winning application with all supportive documentation will be forwarded to the IPA office by the division secretary no later than December 15. Pending the receipt of all documentation in a timely manner, announcements of the official winners will be made by the chairman of the scholarship committee at the earliest scheduled board meeting.

If any division fails to submit the name an eligible winner no scholarship will be awarded to said division. Winners of the scholarships will be eligible to reapply the following year.

### Verification of Eligibility:

The following must accompany all applications:

- 1. A copy of the applicant's current class schedule.
- 2. A copy of an invoice or statement from the bursar's office indicating full or partial tuition payment.
- 3. A copy or printout of a financial instrument electronic or other document showing full or partial tuition payment.

- \*November Division meeting Random drawing
- \*December 15 Winning application due at IPA office




